

# PATTERN

# AMIGURUMI TIGER

I hope you'll enjoy my pattern for a crochet tiger. A finished toy will measure about 11,5 cm (4.5 inches) standing.

## Materials:

- **yarn:**
  - 100% acrylic sport yarn  
300m (327 yards) in 100g  
orange and white
  - 100% acrylic fingering yarn  
520 meters (569 yards) in 100g  
black
- **hook:** 3mm
- **sewing needle**
- **scissors**
- **stuffing**
- **2 small beads for eyes**
- **stitch marker (optional)**
- **wooden skewer to help you with the stuffing (optional)**

### List of abbreviations used:

**ch** – chain  
**sc** – single crochet  
**inc** – increase  
**dec** – decrease  
**x5/x3** – repeat 5 times/3 times  
**(n)** – number of stitches in a round

## Head and body:

### ch2

1. 6sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook (6)
2. inc x6 (12)
3. (1sc, inc) x6 (18)
4. (2sc, inc) x6 (24)
5. – 8. 1sc around (24)
9. (2sc, dec) x6 (18)
10. (1sc, dec) x6 (12)
11. (1sc, dec) x4 (8)
12. (1sc, inc) x4 (12)
13. (3sc, inc) x6 (15)
14. (4sc, inc) x3 (18)
15. 1sc around (18)



16. (2sc, inc) x6 (24)
  17. 1sc around (24)
  18. (3sc, inc) x6 (30)
  19. 1sc around (30)
  20. (1sc, dec) x10 (20)
  21. (3sc, dec) x4 (16)
- You can start stuffing.
22. (1sc, dec) x5, 1sc (11)
  23. dec x5, 1sc (6)

Add more stuffing if needed, fasten off leaving a long piece of thread for sewing.  
Don't sew the opening closed yet. Embroider the stripes with black fingering yarn or crochet thread.

### Ear (make 2):

#### Ch2

1. 4sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook (4)
2. (inc, 1sc) x2 (6)
3. (inc, 2sc) x2 (8)

Ears don't require stuffing. Fasten off leaving quite a long thread for sewing.  
Embroider the stripes with black fingering yarn or crochet thread.



### Muzzle:

#### *white* ch2

1. *white* 6sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook (6)
2. *white* inc x2, *orange* inc, 2sc, inc (10)
3. *white* 4sc, *orange* 6sc (10)
4. *white* inc, 2sc, inc, *orange* 6sc (12)

Fasten off, leaving a piece of thread for sewing the muzzle onto the head.

### Arm (make 2):

#### ch2

1. 6sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook (6)
2. 4sc, inc x2 (8)
3. 1sc around (8)



4. (dec, 2sc) x2 (6)
5. – 7. 1sc around (6)
8. (dec, 1sc) x2 (4)

Stuff the arm, fasten off leaving a long piece of thread for sewing. Sew the opening closed by pulling the thread through the loops of all the remaining stitches. You should still have quite a long piece of thread left for sewing the arms onto the body. Embroider the stripes with black fingering yarn or crochet thread.

### Leg (make 2):

#### ch2

1. 6sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook (6)
2. 3sc in each of the next 3sc, 3sc (12)
3. 1sc around (12)
4. dec, 1sc, sc3tog, 1sc, dec, 3sc (8)
5. – 8. 1 sc around (8)
9. (dec, 2sc) x2 (6)



Stuff lightly, fasten off leaving a long piece of thread for sewing. Sew the opening closed as you did with arms. Embroider the stripes with black fingering yarn or crochet thread.

### Tail:

#### ch2

1. 5sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from the hook (5)
2. – 8. 1sc around (5)

Fasten off, leaving a long piece of thread for sewing. Embroider the stripes with black fingering yarn or crochet thread.



### Assembling:

Sew the ears and muzzle on the head.  
 Embroider the nose and eyes.  
 Tie them together and bury the ends in the head.

Attach the legs and arms to the body. Sew the tail on the back of the body. When you're done, pull the ends through the opening in the body, tie them together and hide inside of the body.

And you're done! :)
